Village of Chester Board of Trustees Meeting April 7, 2014

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Chester held their monthly business meeting in the Village Hall meeting room on Monday, April 7, 2014. Members present: Mayor Philip Valastro, Deputy Mayor Philip Roggia, Trustee Betty-Jo Bono, Trustee John T Bell and Trustee Carole Duffy. Also present: Village Attorney Ian Schlanger, Village Treasurer Angela O'Neill, Police Chief Peter Graziano, Street Superintendent, Charles Bono, Water Treatment Operator, Thomas Becker and Village Code Enforcement Officer John Orr. Mayor Philip Valastro opened the meeting at 7:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

AUDIT OF BILLS: Mayor Philip Valastro noted audit of monthly bills for approval was complete.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The approval of Village monthly business minutes and Public Hearing meeting minutes of (March 10, 2014) were tabled until May 12, 2014.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer Angela O'Neill was present and read report as follows:

- (1) EXPENSE CONTROL REPORT: Year to Date Expense Control Reports Attached. If you have any specific questions related to this document, please feel free to discuss with me.
- (2) REVENUE CONTROL REPORT: Year to Date Income Control Reports Attached. If you have any specific questions related to this document, please feel free to discuss with me.
- (3) 2013-2014 BUDGET: As we approach the end of our current fiscal year, an analysis of the current budget to identify any accounts that may need line item transfers. A formal budget modifications report will be ready for board approval during the May 201 Village Board Meeting.
- (4) 2014-2015 BUDGET: The 2014-2015 Budget presented this evening includes a 0% percent increase in Village Tax Rate. Tax rate will remain at \$13.34 per thousand of assessed value.
- (5) SEWER: Unpaid Sewer is no longer being collected. Unpaid sewer amounts will be relevied on to 2014-2015 Village Tax bill along with a 10% Penalty. Approximately \$119,000 of unpaid sewer bills will be relevied.
- (6) Sewer Bill #1829 to be reversed upon Village Board approval.

(7) Sewer Rates will increase to \$334.00 annually or \$83.50/quarter. Past Due quarterly installments will be assessed late fees.

A motion to adjust sewer bill#1829 was made by Trustee Betty-Jo Bono, second by Trustee Carole Duffy. Motion unanimously passed.

A motion to approve to the Treasurers report was made by Trustee John T Bell, second by Trustee Betty-Jo Bono. Motion unanimously passed.

I have reviewed the Building department fee schedule and have made some adjustments. No changes to the fees have been done since 2010 and before that 2007. The suggested new rates are enclosed.

- <u>IRS SCAM</u>: Telephone/Email scam involving a person calling or emailing saying you owe money and taking an immediate payment over the phone or via email link. Government agencies don't do business like that. They will not ask for personal information or threaten prosecution if you don't pay.
- Contract Scams: Spring is here. If someone says they're a contractor and that your roof needs repair or driveway needs to be re-paved, don't jump at the offer. Ask for company information and do your homework. Check to see if you really need the repair and check out the contractor. Above all DON'T GIVE THEM ANY MONEY! You should never give a contractor the full amount up front. Make sure you get written, detailed estimates that specifies what work is to be done and what materials are going to be used.
- One ring cell phone scam Scammers are using auto dialers to call cell phone numbers across the country. Scammers let the phone ring once-just enough for a missed call message to pop up.
 The scammers hope you'll call back, either because you believe a legitimate call was cut off, or you will be curious about who called. If you call back you'll be put on hold. While on hold you're slammed with large charges at the top of the international calling rate.

The calls are from phone numbers with three digit area codes that look like they are from inside the U.S., but actually are associated with international phone numbers - often in the Caribbean. The area codes include: 268, 284,473, 664, 649, 767, 809, 829, 849 and 876.

If you've been a victim of the "one-ring" scam, try to resolve the charges with your cell phone carrier. If that doesn't work, file a complaint with the <u>Federal Trade Commission</u> and the <u>Federal Communications</u> Commission.

STREET REPORT: Street Superintendent Charles Bono was present and read report as follows:

On March 21st Gannon Municipal Equipment Delivered our new sweeper. Aron from Showalter's Equipment was present with Jerry Gannon and gave us a demo and training session on how the sweeper operates. It is a totally different sweeper from the sweeper that was purchase 25 years ago. Johnston will be sending a representative down from the factory within the next 2-weeks to go into detail of the servicing and maintenance program.

We have started breaking down and removing some of our snow removal equipment and prepping them for summer storage.

We have started going around and putting down topsoil and grass seed where the edges of the lawns were damage from the snow plows.

As of April 1st our Green Waste Removal Program has begun: Green Waste Materials must be curbside by 6:00am on Fridays. Branches must be no longer than 4 ft. and tied. Grass clippings and leaves must be in biodegradable bags. (Bags are available at Deli USA, Chester Market, Village Hall & Street Dept. Garage.

I would like to remind the village residents and everyone parking on village streets that the snow ordinance for parking on the street will end on April 15. However the Street Sweeping Ordinance will go into effect on all Fridays in which there is No Parking on Main St. (ALL) and Winkler PL. from the hours of 3:00am-6:00am.

WATER REPORT: Water Treatment Operator Thomas Becker was present and read report as follows:

- 1= Daily filtration plant and well #12 routine.
- 2= Backflow preventer testing is ongoing.
- 3= Quarterly meters have been read.
- 4= The 2006 GMC truck has been serviced and a new alternator has been installed in the 2005 ford truck.
- 5= At the filtration plant EFMs are done twice each week and I would like permission to have the driveway seal coated.
- 6= I have two prices for a Multi equip model SP2S13H20A self-propelled street saw. The low price was from Vallano Bros., Inc. for \$3,599.00 and \$344.17 for a blade. Total \$3943.17. The second price from Southern Tool.com is a total of \$4209.11
- 7= I would like permission to have the main control panel replaced at Well #12 at a cost of \$5,843.00 by Marks Enterprises Inc. A second price from Harry F. Rotolo & Sons was \$7,475.00
- 8= I would like permission to have the driveway at the Filtration Plant Seal coated. I have three quotes and the lowest was Jet Black for \$595.00
- 9= I am currently working on our Emergency Response Plan and Vulnerability Assessment to answer OCHD comments

Water Commissioner, Tom Becker asked the board for authorization to seal the driveway at the Water Filtration Plant. Tom mentioned to the Board that he acquired 3 quotes and the least of the 3 quotes was in the amount of \$595.00.

A motion to authorize Water Commissioner, Tom Becker to go with the least of the 3 quotes (\$595.00) to have the driveway at the Water Filtration Plant sealed, was made by Trustee Carole Duffy, second by Trustee John T Bell. Motion unanimously passed.

Water Commissioner, Tom Becker asked the board for permission to order a road cutter. Tom mentioned to the Board that he acquired 3 quotes and the least of the 3 quotes was in the amount of \$3943.00. The total includes \$3599.00 for the road cutter and \$344.00 for the blade.

A motion to authorize Water Commissioner, Tom Becker to go with the least of the 3 quotes (\$3943.00) for the purchase of the road cutter and blade, was made by Trustee Carole Duffy, second by Trustee John T Bell. Motion unanimously passed.

PARK& RECREATION: Trustee Betty-Jo Bono was present and updates for Park & Recreation was reported by Tracey Schuh as follows:
