# Village of Chester Board of Trustees Meeting September 10, 2012

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Chester held their monthly business meeting in the Village Hall meeting room on Monday, September 10, 2012. Members present: Mayor Philip Valastro, Deputy Mayor Philip Roggia, Trustee John J. Collins, Trustee Carole Duffy and Trustee Betty-Jo Bono. - Spoke to NYS DOT, and requested a fence be erected on the SR94 overpass over the Heritage Trail due to the recent incident. They advise that they will look into it and may be possible.

HIGHWAY REPORT: Street Superintendent Charles Bono was present and read report as follows:

Roadwork:

Blacktopped around catch basins that were repaired by 2515 Whispering Hills Dr., 3402 Whispering Hills Dr., by the entrance to Clubhouse II, and 1 Carpenter Rd. Also Blacktopped ditch lines where new drainage line was installed on Vadala Rd, where new sewer service line was installed on Greycourt Ave. (Sewer service line for 2 School Street) and ditch line where drainage line was repaired by 15 Railroad Ave.

Repaired catch on Nucifora Blvd.

Another round of road side mowing, weed whacking, and picking up garbage was completed throughout the village. (Including the industrial park)

We continue with the normal weekly sweeping, moving and picking up of bags and brush.

The street department would like the boards' approval to award the bid from Westchester Tractor Inc. for \$27,254.00 to purchase a new chipper.

WATER REPORT: Water Treatment Operator Thomas Becker read water report as follows:

- 1= Daily Filtration Plant and Well #12 routine.
- 2= Weekly mowing at all water facilities.
- 3= All unpaid water bills have been paid.
- 4= At the Filtration plant we are still having problems with the air compressors not operating properly and a level transmitter that turns the filter skids on and off stopped working causing the clear well to completely drain out.
- 5= Tom and Joe attended a certification lab class in Ghent NY on Aug, 23.
- 6= a new fire hydrant was installed on Hudson St to replace an old Woods Mathews hydrant.
- 7= The repairs to the interior paint at the Whispering Hills water tower are scheduled for September 17, 2012.
- 8= We repaired a private fire hydrant behind Shop Rite that was knocked by a truck.
- 9= The Ford and Chevy pickup trucks have been serviced.

## PARK& RECREATION: No report submitted.

- Resolution disciplinary hearing procedures for members of the Village of Chester police department was tabled until further notice.
- EAP- Employee Assistance Program –a motion to accept the agreement.
