4. Resolution Authorizing the Mayor and/or the Chief of Police to Enter into an Inter-Municipal Agreement with Orange County Regarding Reimbursement for Overtime for Patrols Related to DWI Offenses:

WHEREAS, Orange County (the "County"), in order to promote safer roadways, created and maintains a program, the Stop-DWI/Traffic Safety Program, that, in part, reimburses local police departments for overtime spent on patrols to detect and deter intoxicated drivers and tasks related thereto; and

WHEREAS, the County, from time to time, proffers an Inter-Municipal Agreement (the "Agreement") to the Village Police Department to reimburse the Village for overtime and other expenses related to the department's efforts to prevent and prosecute DWI offenses; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police of the Village of Chester Police Department, has reviewed the Agreement and approves of the same; and

WHEREAS, the Attorney for the Village has reviewed and approved the basic terms of the Agreement,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

WHEREAS, the Village Board hereby accepts the proposal of FEERICK LYNCH MACCARTNEY & NUGENT, PLLC to also serve as Labor Relations Counsel to the Village for Labor Relations matters at the hourly rate of \$210.00 per hour.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is resolved as follows:

Section 1. All "WHEREAS" paragraphs are incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full herein.

Section 2. Feerick Lynch MacCartney & Nugent, PLLC ("FLMN") is authorized to appear and represent the Village on all Labor Relations matters, as directed by the Mayor, and shall be compensated for all services performed for the Village with regard to Labor Relation matters at the hourly rate of \$210.00 per hour which will be separately invoiced to the Village.

Section 3. This Resolution shall be effective immediately.
