STREET REPORT: Street Superintendent Charles Bono read his report as follows:

We have completed our 2^{nd} round of roadside mowing, weed whacking and picking up garbage throughout the village.

We would like to thank the Village Board for letting the Street Dept purchase the used hot box.

Back in my May Report I had talked about the CHIPS Budget for 2019-2020 and I had mentioned that the Extreme Winter Recovery Program had been taken out of the budget. As of June 17, 2019, the Extreme Winter Recovery Program has been put back into the budget. Our appropriation will be \$8,852.19 which is the same as last year.

WATER REPORT: Water Commissioner Gary Green, Jr., read his report as follows:

- 5) Changing water meters continues. We are focusing on Whispering Hills at the moment.
- 6) Dug with contractor to install temporary water for new credit union.
- 7) Sealed driveway at the well house
- 8) Monthly samples were taken to lab for testing
- 9) Marking out of water lines for Dig safe N.Y.
- 10) Fixed fire hydrant that was struck by a vehicle near Steris.
- 11) Dug to find water main for new houses on Carpenter Rd. Worked with contractor to perform a wet tap on the main. The contractor had issues with the tapping sleeve so they had to reschedule the wet tap.
- 12) Quarterly water meters were read.
- 13) Power washed the filter plant.
